Currently our youngest resident and daughter of our homeowner Jessica Fields. Born on May 7th, 6lbs.14oz.

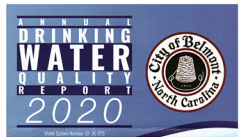


Congrats Kim!
